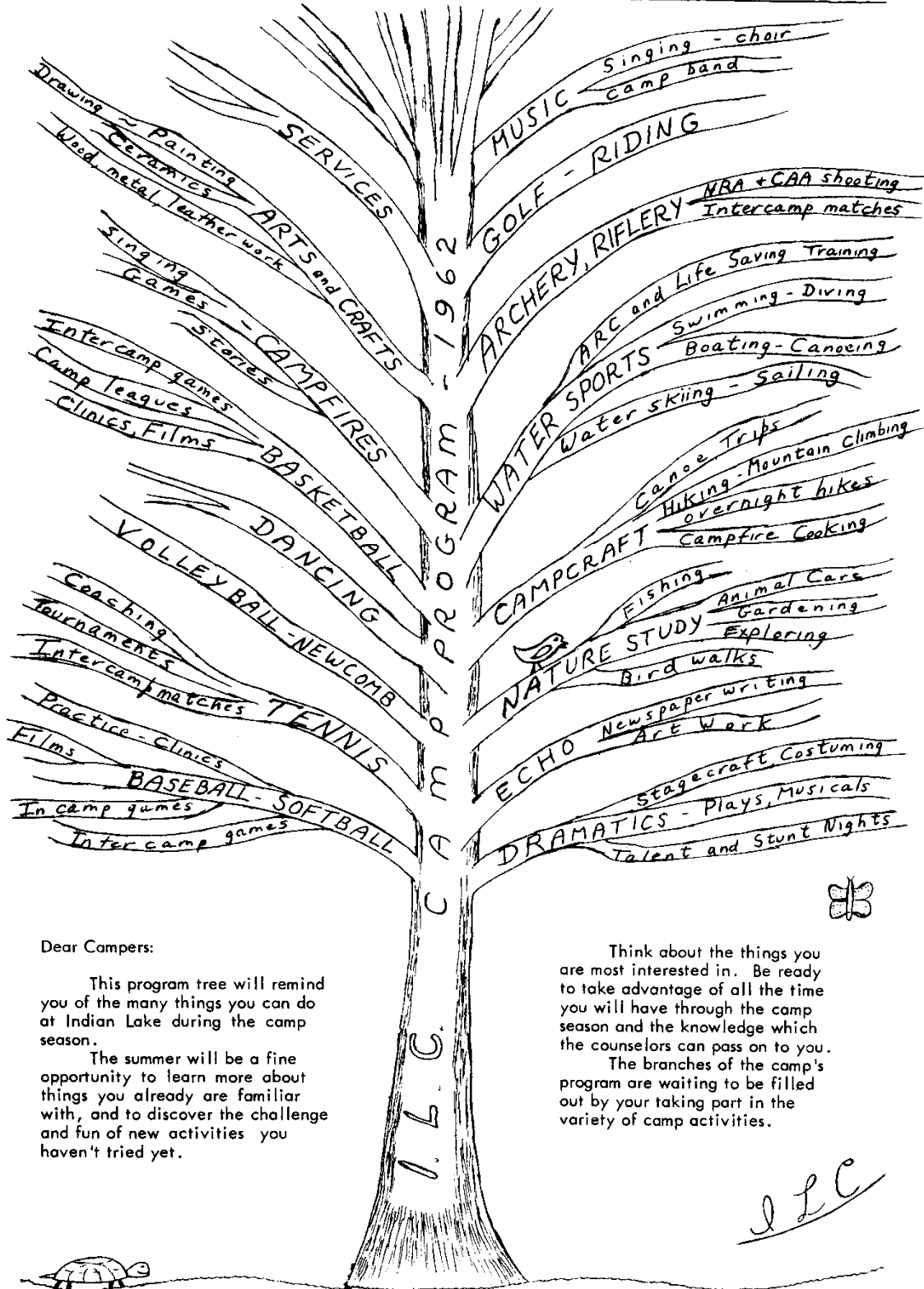

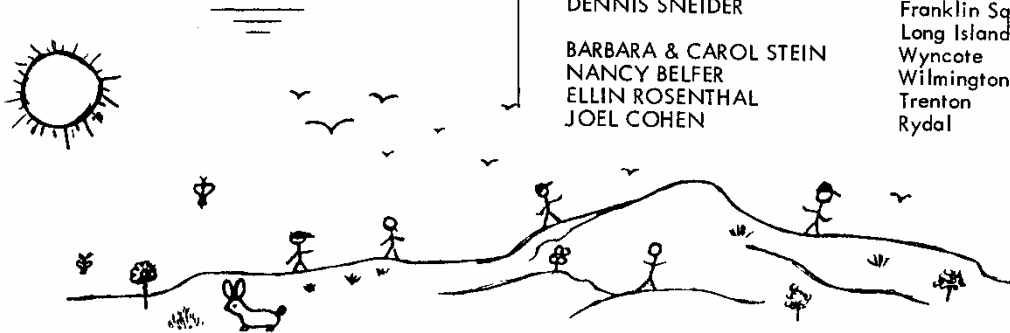


TO MY GIRLS:
